APA citation

How to Cite a Book in APA

Use the following template to cite a book using the APA citation format. We also provide style guides for the [MLA](#), [Chicago](#), and [Turabian](#) styles. To have your bibliography or works cited list automatically made for you, check out [our free APA citation generator](#).

Citing a book in print

APA format structure:

Author, A.A. (Year of Publication). Title of work. Publisher City, State: Publisher.

APA format example:

Finney, J. (1970). Time and again. New York, NY: Simon and Schuster.

Notes: When citing a book in APA, keep in mind:

- Capitalize the first letter of the first word of the title and any subtitles, as well as the first letter of any proper nouns.
- The full title of the book, including any subtitles, should be stated and italicized.

Citing a general website article with an author

APA format structure:

Author, A.A. (Year, Month Date of Publication). Article title. Retrieved from URL

Citing a general website article without an author

APA format structure:

Article title. (Year, Month Date of Publication). Retrieved from URL

What is a journal database?

A database is a collection of information, in this case journal articles, arranged in individual records which can be searched by computer. Some journal databases also include conference papers, book chapters, reports, dissertations, books and other types of information.

Journal Databases collect together articles in a subject area. The subject could be general (eg. education) or more narrowly defined (eg. Australian criminology).

They allow you to search for articles using keywords. You can combine keywords or use a phrase to focus your search to find articles most relevant to your topic.

Journal databases generally provide a reference or citation - enough information to allow you to find the article. The citation would normally include: the title and author of the article; the journal name, volume and issue numbers, pages and date; subject headings and often an abstract (summary) of the article. Sometimes the full text of the article is also available.
